This sure is busy time of year:

<u>POOL</u>- The pool was to open June 10th just after school got out. The pump was bad and needed to be replaced. The pool is now up and running. Trustees will be getting a manual of pool maintenance procedures in order. Anyone with past knowledge of running the pool please contact a trustee.

<u>Pool Parking Lot</u>- We need to thank Wally at the Bainbridge Service Department for grading and rolling the gravel in the pool parking lot. School buses and kids doing donuts had really torn up the gravel.

<u>4 Way Stop Sign</u>- The Bainbridge Trustees embraced our recommendation for Haskins and Lake in the Woods Trail to become a four way stop. Matt Lynch said he would take their written letter to the county engineers office personally. Joanne and I will be working with the 4 residents at that intersection to clear away brush and branches to make it easier to see up and down from all 4 stop signs.

Front Entrance- A couple of weeks ago John Wheeler from our development met us to discuss his thoughts about improving the look of our entrance from 306. Trustees Charles Marchant and Patrick Benz will co chair the committee to start improving that area. Resident Ty Haines will also be a part of that project. In the near future we will concentrate on clearing old dead and unsightly growth from around the ponds to expose the more attractive vegetation. Many hours will be required to complete this project. We will get started in mid-July. Volunteers with chain saws are needed!!

<u>LITW Constitution and Declarations</u>- LITW has in place a document that originated with its inception. We are sadly out dated in some areas and lacking in current language in other areas. Trustees Don Hubbard and Chad Long will be co chairing a committee to relook at these documents to clarify what needs to done to make these current, up to date and state of the art. This will be a long time consuming project. They will need to proceed slowly. They will need our help. Please volunteer if you are interested.

<u>Lake water quality</u>- We have taken water samples and are currently analyzing them. We want to monitor the big lake water quality on a regular basis. We will be using our lake management company Willow Valley and an independent source here in Chagrin to run this analysis. Ty Haines has some background in this department and will help us to understand the results.

Please get out and enjoy this wonderful neighborhood. Play golf on Friday nights, go swimming at the heated pool, go fishing in the big lake, walk around and say hi to your neighbors. The trustees are trying to proactively keep LITW attractive to current residents and prospective new residents. It takes a lot of work to make this happen. You have good thoughts and ideas. Do you have some time? Have you volunteered lately to be a trustee or a committee member? Please think about it.
